GRADE POINT AVERAGE REQUIREMENTS:

Grade point averages are reviewed during three checkpoints admission to teacher education (see Requirements for Admission to Teacher Education), admission to student teaching (requires a 275 average overall; a 275 average in content area; a 275 average in professional education) and at the time of completion/graduation (275 overall).

IMPORTANT: Upon completion of 60 undergraduate credit hours (junior status), students enrolled or desiring enrollment in education coursework beyond 12 hours credit MUST be admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Students must be admitted to Teacher Education prior to enrollment in upper level teacher education courses.
