

Your Undergraduate GPA and How to Achieve Good Standing

Meaning of Each Academic Standing Level

Good Standing

A student who has a cumulative (overall) GPA of 2.00 or higher.

Academic Warning

A student who has a cumulative GPA less than 2.00 and falls into one of the GPA's on the chart to the right based on total GPA hours attempted**. Students on Academic Warning may register for a maximum of 16 credit hours in a regular semester.

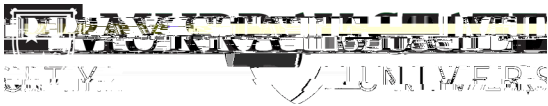
Academic Probation

A student who has a cumulative GPA less than 2.00 and falls into one of the GPA's listed on the chart to the right based on total GPA hours attempted**. Students on Academic Probation may register for a maximum of 16 credit hours in a regular semester.

Probation Continued

A student who is already on Academic Probation from their prior semester who does not meet the cumulative GPA threshold for hours attempted for Academic Warning or Good Standing, but earns a semester GPA of 2.00 or higher will remain on probation and may register for a maximum of 16 credit h

**Helpful Tip: Total GPA hours attempted is based on all attempted credit hours, including those on Academic Probation. Total GPA hours attempted is based on all attempted credit hours, including those on Academic Probation.



Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) versus Academic Standing

The Department of Education and Kentucky Commonwealth each require student to meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements in order to remain eligible for federal and state loans and grants. Failure to meet the standards could lead to loss of eligibility for both federal and state financial assistance.

A SAP financial aid suspension is not the same as an Academic Suspension. Students may receive a SAP financial aid suspension, but be academically eligible to enroll and continue taking courses at Murray State without receiving any federal or state financial assistance. Students who receive a SAP notice should contact the Student Financial Services Office for more information regarding their financial aid eligibility and how to appeal. SAP notifications are sent directly to students by Student Financial Services. Notices of Academic Suspension that prevent registration are sent directly to students by the Office of the Registrar.

Academic Suspension Appeals

A student who has been academically suspended from MSU and feels it was due to circumstances beyond their control may appeal in writing to the Registrar for special consideration. The student's request will be forwarded to the Academic Appeals Committee for review. Dual Credit and Transfer Work

College credit earned while in high school and transfer work from other colleges/universities will impact your Murray State academic standing. Students may be admitted to Murray State on good standing, academic warning or probation.
